The Ostrich, approx. 15 cm long 13cm wide and weigh 20 x heavier than a chicken egg

who can spell the Authors name? Dr.Seuss - Theodor Seuss "Ted" Geisel was an American children's author

3.Where did the easter bunny come from?

The Anglo-Saxons worshipped the goddess Eostre, and a celebration of spring. Eostre was depicted holding a baby rabbit as a sign of new life and spring. Christians adopted this festival of new life as meaning new life through Jesus.

4.Easter Island belongs to which South American country?

Chile, A remote volcanic island in Polynesia. Its native name is Rapa Nui. It's famed for archaeological sites, including nearly 900 monumental statues called moai, created by inhabitants during the 13th–16th centuries. The moai are carved human figures with oversize heads.

5.Which Russian jewellery firm is famous for designing elaborate jewel encrusted eggs?

Faberge - Possibly as many as 69 were created, of which 57 survive today. Virtually all were manufactured between 1885 and 1917 the most famous being the 52 "Imperial" eggs, 46 of which survive, made for the Russian Tsars as Easter gifts for their wives and mothers

Mel Gibson – The film depicts the final twelve hours in the life of **Jesus** of Nazareth

7.Which fruit cake with layers of marzipan is traditionally eaten at Easter?

Simnel cake - It is distinguished by two layers of marzipan

, one in the middle and one on top. The top layer is capped by a circle of 12 balls also made of marzipan to represent the 12 disciples

8. Who "betrayed the son of man with a kiss" when Jesus was arrested?

Judus Iscariot -He was a disciple and one of the original Twelve Disciples of Jesus Christ. According to the gospels, Judas betrayed Jesus to the Sanhedrin in the Garden of Gethsemane by kissing him and addressing him as "rabbi" to reveal his identity to the crowd who had come to arrest him.

9.Nick Easter is a professional sportsman in which sport?

Rugby Union He played as a Number 8 for Orrell, Harlequins and the England national team.

10.Which century did Chocolate arrive in England ?

17th Century, Don Hernán Cortés, brought cocoa beans back to Spain in 1528, the custom of drinking the chocolate spread across Europe, reaching England in the 1650s.
