- That Bibury Allotment Gardens\* and Swan Hotel Gardens, Arlington are both restored to Policy EN3 Local Green Spaces Item 1. (\*Bibury Allotment Gardens are identified on the Conservation Map of Bibury which includes Cemetery Lane and Church Road).
- That a request for a TPO is made for the remaining fruit trees on the grounds that felling in that area has already taken place.

The Council agreed that the Allotment Gardens are intrinsic to the beauty of the village (once restored). The Clerk is to write to the District Council asking for it to be listed in the Local Plan under Policy EN3 as a Local Green Space.

It was noted that the Trees are already in the Conservation Area, so are afforded some protection. (The issue for these trees is lack of enforcement not the lact of a Protection Order).
