An offer has been received to pay for the refurbishment of the telephone box at Arlington. I have contacted BT, to ask for permission and if they will supply the paint.

Cottage near Arlington Green. A request to explore whether some drainage work can be carried out on a property neighbouring Arlington Green, which would involve some work encroaching on the Green. I have sent an inquiry to a land solicitor asking them for a quote to draw up a suitable agreement. Any legal costs will be borne by the applicant. Once received, I will include on a future agenda.

Hatherop Primary School - we are currently needing to raise a massive £1.5million for a new hall and additional building work. We have lots of fundraising events planned, once of which is a series of runs on the 14th of September. This includes a 10k along the beautiful Coln to Bibury loop. The run sticks to public footpaths and we have got the support of all the relative landowners. To ensure that it is an exact 10k distance we need to have a short section in Bibury (https://explore.osmaps.com/route/21861682/Coln-Valley-10km). We will ensure there is appropriate signage and marshals throughout this section. We are anticipating no more than 100 runners who will be fairly spaced out and should arrive in Bibury between 11:45 and 12:30. We have all the appropriate insurance and


race permits.

Social enterprise hub to open in former House of Fraser in Cirencester


