CLERKS REPORT – OCTOBER 2024

Defibrillators – The defibrillator pads at the Football Club have been replaced. The defibrillator at Rack Island was recently deployed, though it was not ultimately used. In such cases, I receive an incident report, after which I inspect the device to ensure it is fully operational and determine if replacement pads or other maintenance is required. I then file a report to confirm the defibrillator's status as active and ready for future use.

Road Closures Please be advised of the following closure:

This road will be closed (as per the attached plan) from 23/10/24 to 25/10/24 to allow for water pipe repair work by Thames Water.

Emergency and pedestrian access will be maintained.

Bench at Ablington – The existing bench is showing significant signs of wear and is in need of replacement. I will include a recommendation on the next agenda to replace it with a Royal British Legion Wooden Bench, priced at £700 plus the cost of fixtures and installation (see image below). This purchase can be funded through the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), with the Council set to receive over £2,000 later this month from the development work currently being undertaken at Ablington Manor.
