Defibrillators – I conduct monthly inspections of the defibrillators at Rack Island and the Football Club. Each location follows a different reporting procedure, with Rack Island requiring two separate reports. The defibrillator at the Football Club requires new pads, as they have a shelf life of two years and the current ones are nearing expiration. I have placed an order for two replacement sets to ensure continued readiness.

Gloucestershire County Council – Strategic Planning Consultation

We are writing to you to remind you that the consultation on Gloucestershire County Council's Local Development Guide (LDG) closes on **29th September 2024**.

If you wish to make representations to the Council on this document, you can find the relevant details on our consultation page using this link <u>https://haveyoursaygloucestershire.uk.engagementhq.com/local-development-guide-consultation</u>

The purpose of the LDG is to provide information to local planning authorities, developers, and all stakeholders on the types of infrastructure where Gloucestershire County Council may seek funding to mitigate the impacts of the proposed development; to make it acceptable in planning terms

The LDG needs to be periodically reviewed to ensure it reflects the latest published national and local guidance. The existing LDG was adopted in March 2021.

The public consultation is open from Monday 8 July until Sunday 29 September, at 5pm.

Subject to any material changes required in response to the representations received through this consultation period, a second consultation may be required to conclude the review process.

If a second public consultation is required, this will commence in November 2024 for a period of 4 weeks.

The aim is for an updated LDG to be adopted by Gloucestershire County Council's Cabinet in March 2025.

Planning Changes - The government has announced plans to overhaul the planning system and increase housebuilding. Plans include introducing mandatory planning targets to deliver 1.5 million new homes over the next five years, updating the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) to bring back mandatory housing targets, ensuring every area has a local plan and building the next generation of new towns. Among the proposals in the <u>eight week consultation on the NPPF</u> are restoring mandatory housing targets and updating the method used to calculate them, not implementing the Infrastructure Levy as introduced in the Levelling-up and Regeneration Act 2023, introducing the concept of grey belt into green belt considerations, changing affordable housing and mix policy, refocusing design policy on good design rather than 'beauty', and no changes to neighbourhood planning. We will be responding to the NPPF consultation as well as seeking engagement with the <u>New Towns Taskforce</u>.
